**Reminder** – free and reduced price meal applications for the 2014-2015 school year CANNOT be used for next school year. Prior year applications submitted will not be accepted and will require families to submit a new 2014-2015 free and reduced price meal application.

The 2014-2015 applications are available now if you would like to go ahead and fill it out. Go to the Pasco County School Board web site at www.pasco.k12.fl.us.

We are asking each family to complete the Free/Reduced-Price Meal Application. This will allow us to have the most accurate records to be eligible for grants, financial assistance and to best serve the needs of our students and families. #### Registration

Registration for all students is Tuesday August 12 from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm in the cafeteria. You will be able to verify student information, sign up for the free and reduced lunch program, pay school fees, pick up your students schedule and walk the campus.

You will be given your student's registration form to verify, a student access card to complete, and a general information packet. Once you have verified the registration form and completed the student access card you will then take both to the appropriate grade level table to complete the process of paying your fees and receiving your student's schedule.

As in the past we will accept cash and checks but starting this year we will also accept credit card payments. There will be a 3% convenience fee charge for use.

If you do not have any bus information on the schedule there will be someone in the back office that can help you pick a bus stop. Due to a change in policy – no new bus stops will be added for at least the first 10 days of school. You will have to pick the closest bus stop to your house. If you want to request a new stop you will be able to complete a request form that we will forward to the transportation department.

We will have a representative from Food and Nutritional Services available with the free and reduced meal forms for you to complete. <u>Remember</u> – you must complete a new form every year.

We will also have representatives available to help you sign up for the Parent Support Group, School Advisory Council and Volunteer applications.

Once you have your student's schedule you are welcome to follow the schedule and locate the rooms.

If you cannot attend on Tuesday we will have a make up registration on Friday August 15 from 8:00 am – 2:30 pm in the main office.

#### **Dress Code**

#### Electronics

In addition to dress policies, please also be familiar with the policy on electronics, including music players, games, phones, laptops, netbooks, iPads, and cell phones. We realize these devices are important to most students, and that they can be used for both academic and personal needs.

During class, however, all electronics must be turned off and put away, unless specifically directed or granted permission by a teacher. All personal computers must be registered with the school's Resource Officer. You will be able to register your device during lunch beginning the first week of school.

#### Parents of Incoming 7th Grade Students for the 2014-2015 School

#### Year

Students entering, repeating or transferring into the 7th grade will need to provide documentation for the Tdap vaccine. This is a state of Florida requirement that must be met prior to returning to school, by registration day August 12 if possible.

If this immunization has been given and you have not notified CENMS please do so in writing. Please provide our school with verification of the date it was given and the location of where it was administered. We will need that information in writing from a physician. (Blue immunization card)

If this immunization has not been given by registration day, you should contact your family physician or the Health Department prior to registration day.

Students will <u>not</u> receive a schedule for the 2014-2015 school year on registration day if they are not in compliance with the State of Florida immunization requirements.

#### **Advisory Council**

We have several openings for parents to serve on the School Advisory Council (SAC). This is an important group created by the state legislature to provide advice on school policy. If you are interested in serving on the SAC, be sure to fill out a nomination form at Registration.

#### Athletics

In order for a student in 7th or 8th grade to try out for an athletic team they will need to meet the grade eligibility and have all participation forms and physical forms completely filled out and turned in prior to a student actively engaging in physical activity.

Athletic eligibility, as set by the FHSAA, is that the athlete must have a 2.0 GPA for the previous semester in school. They are also available in hard copy at the school.

There is no try-out fee but if your child makes the team there will be an athletic fee of \$45.00.

All paperwork is due by Tuesday August 12. Mandatory try-outs will take place August 13 – August 15 from 3:00 – 5:00 pm. Transportation must be available by 5:00. Proper attire includes shorts, t-shirt, and football cleats. Gym shoes are also required in case of inclement weather.

The following clothing choices are not permitted at CENMS:

- Short shorts, skirts, or dresses or immodest clothing (i.e. beach/recreation clothing, spandex clothing, gym shorts). May not be shorter than 4" from the middle of their knee.
- Bare midriff or blouses that are too short. Blouses or tops must be <u>long</u> enough so that they <u>could</u> be tucked in or stay tucked in.
- See-through, sheer blouses or dresses; mesh clothing.
- Muscle Shirts, tank tops, halter tops, sun dresses, or clothing with spaghetti straps. Clothing must have sleeves beyond the shoulder seam.
- No pajamas.
- Clothing which is offensive to good taste (through symbols, mottos, decorations, or designs) or which advertises tobacco, alcohol, or drugs.
- Hats or head coverings; sprayed on hair coloring/paint which is disruptive. Hairstyles that are disruptive or unhealthy.
- Pants or shorts that do not fit securely at the waist.
- Wallet chains; neck (dog collar) chains.
- No soft shower shoes normally worn at the beach. No house slippers.
- Low cut tops which are cut below the armpit area.
- Piercings about or around the mouth, nose, or eye areas due to health and safety concerns

Any student in violation of the dress code will be taken to the administration office and required to change. Any student wearing inappropriate clothing will be required to change into appropriate clothing and will not be allowed to cover up the inappropriate article with a jacket, sweater, or another shirt.
